P: Let us return to God, confessing our sin in the assurance of God’s abiding love.

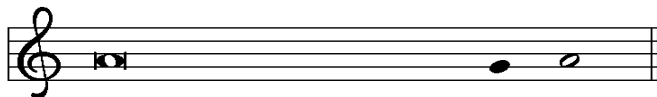
Silence is kept for reflection.

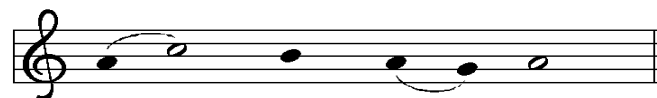

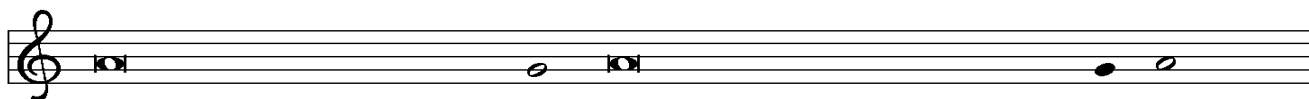

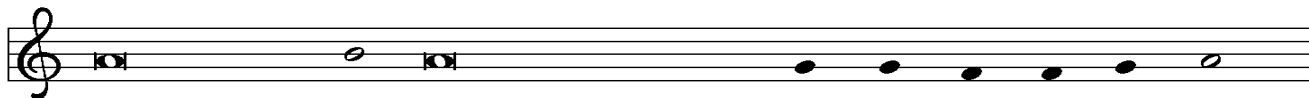
