When the 301 Quilters began a year and a half ago, it started as a group that would cut, sew, assemble and knot cloth to make quilts. From the beginning the group is also good at recycling. We've taken donations from all three congregations of scrap cloth, old shirts and skirts, curtains and sheets to cut and use as squares or backs. Through your donations we've been able to send over 50 quilts to help those in need of shelter or warmth. Through your donations you've kept all those "scraps" from entering a dumpster and landfill. Even the jibs that we have from cutting we save instead of throw away. We are looking into finding a veterinary practice or rescue shelter that would use our saved scraps for bedding, or a fiber art studio or school that would use them for art work projects. (If you have any leads, please let us know!) Thank you for recycling your fabrics to help us make useful items for those in need.

Clergy's Communiqué - Conflict Resolution Training

"The closer an issue is to your identity: the more it hurts; the longer it takes to resolve/manage; the more we need help from others; the more challenging is the process; the more we depend on God." – Dr. Tony Everett, Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary

From our first initial pastoral care classes in seminary, Dr. Everett taught us that conflicts are issues near to our identity. In other words, conflict is inevitable not only in parish settings but in all vocations. Conflict is also healthy and necessary for congregation transformation (growth). Conflict management starts by understanding ourselves better, how we respond to stress and conflict, and from there we can utilize resources to better address a dilemma in the congregation or in any relationship.

I could go on and on, but I will save that for the training, that Trinity's small group leaders and council will participate in on April 27. This mutual goal from council and clergy was presented at the March congregational meeting and now being enacted. While Trinity isn't in conflict crisis (which would be unhealthy), clergy and lay leaders routinely face ministry differences. We all face conflict in our day-to-day relationships outside church. It is how we act, react and interact in those spaces – with the help of God – that determines the positive outcome of our conflict.

Deacon Katie and I will be using our own training to better equip our leaders, and hope that it will be an enriching experience for everyone. As the congregation, we ask your prayers for all those a part of this opportunity. We invite you to ask your small group leader to share their learnings with you.

As we are reminded by author...Luther Smith, "Conflict transformation training as a prerequisite for being effective in building beloved community." May it be so.

Your Gifts In Action ~ Tree, Water & People

Our mission is to improve people's lives by helping communities protect, conserve, and manage the natural resources upon which their long-term well-being depends.

Celebrating 25 years of service, the Fort Collins non-profit organization Trees, Water & People (TWP) has been doing transformative work in parts of Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, and the United States. They believe the people living on degraded lands are the only ones who can restore and protect their environment because they have a vested interest in preserving their local ecosystem (according to the World Wildlife Fund, approximately 80% of the world's biodiversity is protected by indigenous communities.)

TWP facilitates the process by providing the communities access to resources to reach their goals. For example, they have assisted tribal communities in southwestern Colorado in restoring native vegetation in the riparian areas along the Mancos River which has been ravaged by the invasive tamarisk. In Honduras, following a 35-year struggle, the local community has been given authority to manage and protect a natural area as a permanent wildlife refuge. In partnership with the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe and Red Cloud Renewable, over 6,000 ponderosa pine seedlings have been planted in the Bear Butte State Park, SD. TLC Preschool

Welcome Spring! Everyone in the TLC Preschool classroom is more than ready for some warmer weather and the opportunity to explore outdoors!

I'm happy to share two pieces of great news from preschool. Firstly, TLC Preschool received a perfect inspection, with no violations, from CDEC State Licensing this past month. This doesn't happen very often and was the result of hard work and attention to detail. The second piece of great news is that TLC Preschool is now rated as a Level 2 in the Colorado Shines rating program. This advancement was also the result of hard work, and, while we're excited to be at Level 2, we'll be researching the possibility of further advancement.

We continue to have openings available for next school year, but our enrollment has improved somewhat, which is encouraging. According to the National Center for Health Statistics, the United States has been in a cycle of lowered birth rates (falling to their lowest level in more than 40 years) and it isn't expected to increase until 2028 or 2029, so many programs continue to have openings due to fewer young children. But, we're hopeful that we'll be able to add a few more students for next year.

Highlights from Co-Op Committee Meeting

The Co-Op Committee, composed of clergy and lay leaders of each faith community, meeting monthly to discuss the functioning of the faith partnership, coordination of collaborative projects, and other items affecting the faith communities. At the March 13th, 2025 meeting, the following items were discussed:

Judy Matthews from Social/Eco Justice Partnership came to discuss SEJ's interest in having a tamale sale by La Fondita Latina for members of 301 Partner congregations in sometime this year. The business has been involved with both ISAAC and 301 Partners and is in the process of building a restaurant at 128 W. Laurel St.

We reviewed the Holy Week schedule and Raven Agape discussed a brochure his wife, Amy, is working on for the Stations of the Cross.

Pastor Rick and Paul Johnson reported on Trinity's congregational meeting that authorized a task force to work on a 7-year lease agreement for the 301 Faith Partnership to be voted on at Trinity's November, 2025 congregational meeting.

Discussion took place about the recent mailbox vandalism and how to prevent future problems.

Sunday March 9 Annual Congregational Meeting Highlights

*A motion was passed, after discussion, to use our 2024 Ministry Fund Plan surplus of \$21,829.43 as follows: The funds will be held for the fellowship hall furnace replacement, except that \$2,000 will be sent to Lutheran Family Services and \$2,000 will be sent to Global Refuge (formally known as Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service).

Council President Eric Jurgenson introduced the Mutual Expectation process. The council has initiated this process with consideration of the congregation poll responses. He explained, with the use of slides, that the Executive Board and the clergy have worked out the goals together, to address 5 areas: growth, fellowship opportunities, youth education and involvement, varied worship and staff support. Eric enlarged on these goals, emphasizing Saturday worship, staff salaries, completing a ministry audit and improving outside communication and media use. It is expected that council members will visit Saturday night worship, support the Coop, complete conflict resolution training and develop a standard procedure for onboarding new council members. Eric called for comments. There were none. Eric led a litany of acceptance of Mutual Expectations.

A motion was passed, after discussion, to form a committee tasked with drawing up 7-year 301 Faith Partnership leases, with the intention of continuing beyond that term. Our current agreements with St. Paul's Episcopal and with Mary of Magdala Ecumenical Catholic will end March of 2026.


Council Highlights March 18, 2025 Council Meeting Highlights

Property will be obtaining bids for parking lot re-surfacing and striping. More handicapped parking will be added.

Council will be holding a 2-part annual retreat. The first will be April 27 from noon to 2:30 and will consist of conflict resolution training. Small group leaders will be invited. The second will be held on the evening of May 1, from 5:30 to 8:30. The focus will be building an onboarding process for new council members and finishing constitutional edits.

After the March annual meeting, there were complaints about the poor quality of the AV system. Property (Soren Nicholson, chair) will reach out to members who have explored this issue recently, and develop a plan, with the intent of having a solution in place before the next annual meeting.

Rocky Mountain Synod ELCA Advocacy Day at the Capitol, March 18!

Rocky Mtn Synod ELCA members partnered with Together Colorado (a CO multifaith lobbying group) on 3/18 to meet with senators and legislators in Denver. Paul Johnson, Linda Cavazos, James Gearhart and Tim Snyder participated from Trinity. A brief gathering before meeting legislators provided us info for the days activity, included a devotion and prayer from Bishop Meghan. Over 100 people participated and most were able to meet with and discuss issues with their representatives.

The main issues we discussed supported 1) reducing red tape to allow building lower cost housing on property belonging to churches or educational groups, 2) Removing restrictions in place that can prevent those in prison from contacting family and friends, and 3) Changing the requirement from two votes to allow unionization to only one.

We were able to meet with Rep. Boesenecker who is a sponsor of the bill allowing lower cost housing.





This bill passed the house recently and is headed to the senate. It was an interesting and informative day and allowed us to express our desire for action supporting human dignity.
