Property



- Colorado State University also achieved a Platinum level, one of only 9 schools out of 209 to achieve this level in 2024!



Minister's Message - A Prayer of Courage

By now, you should have received a letter sharing that I am moving to Tucson, Arizona for a postdoctoral position for Curtis. A number of you have asked what will come next for me. That is a great question! The short and honest answer is, I don't know. This will truly be a liminal time for me as it will also be for you, the congregation. We are no longer where we were, but not yet where we are going. It is precisely here, between the known and the unknown, that the Prayer of Courage speaks (this prayer is from the Lutheran Book of Worship, author unknown):

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

This is the truth of transition: we often do not see the full path ahead. We cannot predict what's coming or control every step. As I leave Trinity, I am not sure what the future will hold for me. I plan to take time to settle our family in Tucson, establish ourselves, and find a preschool for Theo (maybe Raphi or maybe he will stay home). Because Curtis' position is a 2-year contract, I will most likely not work in another congregation. I am excited to be a member of a congregation and worship with my family. I will apply for positions as I find exciting opportunities, and this is the beauty of the diaconal call (Deacon), I may stay clergy even without serving in a congregation.

I know that, while the future is unclear, God is present in the unknown. Just as I know, God is present with you, Trinity, as you discern the future for this place. I know we are both (you, Trinity as well as I am) being called to a new venture, and I don't know what it will look like, and honestly some days that scares me. But I also know that God's hand is leading us, and God's love supporting us. This has become my daily prayer. I am excited for the next chapter in my life. I know God's hand is leading, and God's love is supporting us. So now, we take the next step (and the next one), with good courage, knowing that God is leading.



We collaborate closely with local businesses, law enforcement, service providers, and city departments to ensure a safe and welcoming environment for all residents.

During these proactive outreach efforts, OFC aims to build trusting relationships with underserved populations, identify their needs, and connect them with higher-level services.
