During recent years, we have designated funds to "Congregational Benevolence" in our Ministry Funds Plan (MFP). During November the congregation will meet to vote on the draft MFP which includes a proposed 7% benevolence out of the total budget, 45% of that amount is directed to the Rocky Mountain Synod. 12 other agencies are proposed to receive the remaining funds including some which are Lutheran-specific, other action oriented services and some with an educational emphasis.

We are all part of the ministry work on behalf of these very worthy causes and celebrate the variety of ways we serve our world. As Jesus spoke in Galilee to his disciples and the people in Matthew 5:16, "...let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in Heaven."

301 FP JET ECO Tip of the Month ~ Radon in Your Home

Radon is an invisible, odorless, tasteless radioactive gas created during the natural decay of uranium in the soil. Radon is everywhere, and Colorado has higher concentrations than other regions. Radon gas is drawn into homes through cracks and openings in basements, crawl spaces and slabs. Radon levels vary from house to house and are dependent on a number of factors including the age, quality and upkeep of the home.

Radon is a class 'A' carcinogen, and long-term exposure to elevated levels has been linked to lung cancer. About half of all homes tested in Fort Collins have radon levels above the EPA action level of 4 pCi/L (picocuries per liter). Your chances of getting radon-induced lung cancer depends on how much radon is in your home, the amount of time you are exposed to it, and whether you are a smoker. Long-term radon exposure is the leading cause of lung cancer in individuals who have never smoked. There were an estimated 21,000 deaths in the U.S in 2018 due to radon-induced lung cancer. The Surgeon General has warned that radon is the 2nd leading cause of lung cancer in the US. Only smoking causes more lung cancer deaths. Don't blame radon for cold or flu symptoms; there are no known symptoms of short-term exposure to radon at the levels typically found in homes.

The City of Fort Collins sells discounted short-term (\$6) and long-term (\$20) radon test kits and are available for purchase at the Fort Collins Senior Center (1200 Raintree Drive). If you reside outside the City limits you can order a radon test kit from the Colorado Public Health & Environment (CDPHE). City code does not require radon testing or mitigation, but The City urges everyone to test their home for radon.

The most common approach for radon mitigation is Active Sub-Slab Depressurization. The idea is to create a vacuum under the foundation or crawlspace which draws out and exhausts radon gas outside the building. These systems can be active or passive, where a passive system vents radon through a pipe that extends from the soil to the roof and acts like a chimney to create a slight vacuum on the soil. An active system simply adds a fan to the passive system to forcibly draw radon from the soil. Highlights from Co-Op Committee Meeting

The Coop Committee, composed of clergy and lay leaders of each faith community, meeting monthly to discuss the functioning of the faith partnership, coordination of collaborative projects, and other items affecting the faith communities. At the October 9, 2025 meeting, the following items were discussed:

Plans for Wednesday evening worship during Advent was discussed and it was agreed to continue using the Holden Evening Prayer liturgy again this year.

Work continues on forming a Safe Lots steering committee with 2 members from each congregation. Anyone interested from Trinity should contact pastor Rick. Trinity's Council will discuss including a vote on this at the November Congregational Meeting. It was pointed out that First United Methodist's website has a very helpful explanation of Safe Lots on their website: https://www.firstchurchfc.org/safeparking. If Trinity and our 301 Faith Partners agree to participate in this pilot program, we would alternate with First United Methodist on a monthly basis.

Lisa Dunworth is conducting a training session on October 22 for welcome hosts and anyone else who's interested on best practices to deal with homeless people who enter the church building during worship.

The possibility of having a training session for active shooter drills was discussed, with no action taken at this time.

Visitor cards in the sanctuary will be updated to include a space for visitors to include their address.

This program assists people experiencing homelessness and living out of their cars and involves a partnership with local nonprofits and the City of Fort Collins. The complete program will need to be presented to each partner congregation for a vote.
