Pastor's Ponderings ~ The Christian Century's Narrative Project

Trinity has always been a well-read, well-informed, academic, theologically astute congregation. While this characteristic continually keeps me on my toes, it is beneficial as I continue to learn and grow alongside you. Thank you!

To that end, *Christian Century* magazine has invited us to pilot a program with them for the next year. We are looking for four people to join with eight others (four each from St. Paul's and Mary of Magdala) to form a small theological reading group, called Community Reading Circles. The group would meet once a month.

You will be provided with a free year of the magazine, meet once a month, and engage in thoughtful conversations around faith, public life, and the big questions shaping our culture.

The Narrative Project responds to prevailing stories that dominate our church; by lifting up alternative stories of faith that are vital, inclusive, and rooted in Christian witness. They believe that action-oriented storytelling and theological reflection are the keys to taking these stories public.

Stewardship Update

The Trinity stewardship team wishes to once again thank the congregation for your generous support of the last two stewardship campaigns. Your investments in our various ministries have positioned our church to move forward with confidence as we conclude 2025 and look forward to 2026, which includes welcoming our new associate pastor Kaari Nieuwlandt to our church family.

As you know, the fall stewardship campaigns take place in order to assess what we can anticipate will be congregation donations for the next year. There is an emphasis on asking folks to make a pledge for their intended giving. It is really the only way to begin building a budget (Ministry Fund Plan) for the next year. We also realize, for a variety of reasons, not everyone feels they can make a pledge. Many families and individuals prefer to make their donations at the end of the year.

With this in mind, here are some numbers we wanted to share with everyone. The 2025 budget (MFP) calls for \$439,400 in congregation donations. As of October 31, 2025, congregation donations totaled \$319,304. Therefore, we need \$120,096 by year end to reach the congregation support goal. November and especially December are historically months with the most donations to the church so we are optimistic of a strong finish for the year.

301 FP JET ECO Tip of the Month

Which uses less energy: microwave or toaster oven? Microwave ovens generally use less energy than toaster ovens for short, simple tasks like reheating or cooking popcorn. They're faster, which means less energy consumption over time. Toaster ovens, on the other hand, may be more efficient when it comes to small baking or broiling tasks that would otherwise require a full-sized oven. They use more energy per minute, but can be more effective in certain use cases. So, if you're primarily reheating or cooking basic meals, go microwave. But if you like to toast, roast, and bake without heating your whole kitchen, a toaster oven could be your new best friend.

For ultimate energy and space savings, some home cooks use both—a compact microwave for speed and a mini toaster oven for texture and flavor. Choose based on what fits your habits and counter best.

Reverse Advent Calendar

What is a Reverse Advent Calendar?? Traditionally, Advent calendars are used to count down the days of Advent in anticipation of Christmas. In church we celebrate weekly the themes of Hope, Peace, Love, and Joy as we anticipate God's gift of Jesus. Most purchased Advent calendars start on December 1 and go until Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. The Advent calendars consist of a series of doors or windows to open, revealing a picture, small chocolate or little gift for each day.

But the Reverse Advent Calendar is different! Instead of receiving a daily gift, those taking part in a reverse calendar DONATE an item each day, thus giving instead of receiving. This year the Social and Eco Justice Ministry is offering a suggestion to participate by following this list of food items to donate to our Little Pantry or the Larimer County Food Bank.

You can also do this in a different way. It doesn't have to be food that you are donating. Maybe put \$1 in a basket each day for your reverse advent calendar and then donate the money to our Little Food Pantry. It is also completely fine to add an item every few days or weekly instead of daily. No matter how you choose to participate, consider doing something small for those in need this Advent season. We are blessed to be a blessing to others as we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. Put your food items in a box or bag that can be plain or decorated. You can bring the food items to church weekly or wait until Christmas Eve whichever works best for you. We will have a table in the fellowship room for donations. Council Meeting Highlights

- ◆Three Trinity members are interested in being part of the SafeLots launch team, participating with 4 people from our 301 Partners. Council anticipates calling a congregational meeting in February or March to present the full program to the congregation for a vote.
- ◆*Property Ministry will work with office staff on setting up and publicizing a process for posting flyers or announcements. Office staff should review and post new announcements. This would cut down on the randomness and the litter from tape and tacks.
- ✦ As part of Council's ongoing efforts to improve onboarding and leadership training, they are collecting ministry chair and officer position descriptions from council members. These documents will be part of the package given to newly elected people, and used by the nominating committee to clarify what these positions involve.
- → The ELCA Synod has revised the church constitution template. Trinity needs to make constitutional revisions as a result. Council came up with a list of members who will be contacted and asked if they would work on this task force.
- ✦As in past years, council will not have a business meeting in December but will have a TGIF-style gettogether. This will be held at 6 PM on December 9 at the Jurgenson home.
